He has edited several books including *The Essential Agrarian Reader: The Future of Culture, Community, and the Land* and *The Art of the Commonplace: The Agrarian Essays of Wendell Berry*. In his teaching and research, Wirzba engages agrarian traditions as a means for revitalizing philosophical and theological reflection.
