EMO expresses condolences for victims of Sikh temple shooting and encourages national day of solidarity

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (EMO) extends our profound condolences to the victims of the shooting at the Sikh temple in Oak Creek, Wis., this past weekend. The terrible tragedy of the loss of family and friends is one we all share today. We stand with the Sikh community throughout the United States and the world in their courage and in their mourning, and we pray for all touched by this tragedy.

We call for the active cultivation of education and cooperation leading to mutual respect among all peoples, faiths, and cultural traditions, to foster a more peaceful society.

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon joins the Wisconsin Council of Churches and other faith communities across the country in calling for Sunday, Aug. 12, as a day in which all faiths will come together to pray for the victims, their families, and for the Sikh community.

We also join with members of the Damesh Darbar Sikh temple in Salem who have asked that Oregonians take this time to learn about the Sikh religion, and the Sikh mission of standing for peace and religious tolerance throughout the world.
