EMO expresses condemnation of immigration raid at Del Monte plant in Portland

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (EMO) condemns the raid conducted Tuesday at the Del Monte plant

in Portland by the federal government's Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency. We are

deeply saddened by this inhumane and unnecessary action, which has torn apart families and caused a great

deal of suffering to children and their parents.

While there are many legitimate concerns about immigration issues, low wage undocumented workers

are not responsible for, and have no power over, the grand political and economic policies that have left

them with few options for a decent life for themselves and their children. The ICE raids have only served to

add to the victimization of honest and honorable, hard-working men and women who ask only for the

opportunity to contribute as equals in our community.

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon joins its voice with faith communities around the country in calling

upon the federal government to develop a humane, respectful and family-centered approach to immigration

reform. We join with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in calling for an immigration bill based on

five principles:

To make family a priority in immigration law.

To insist that worker programs contain protection for U.S. citizens and immigrant workers.

To allow for earned legalization for undocumented immigrants.

To restore due process protection for immigrants.

To respond to the economic, political and social root causes of immigration.

We also call on the ICE to end the arrests of undocumented workers who have broken no laws other than those related to their immigration status, while immigration reform is under way in congress. We call upon our governmental representatives to pass immigration reform legislation that will provide a reasonable path to legalization for undocumented immigrants, make family unification a priority in immigration law and guarantee that all workers have access to protective labor laws. We also ask our representatives, and all of civil society, to work to address the economic, social and political conditions throughout the world that lead to disruptive and uncontrolled emigration.

We are guided by the ancient scriptural admonition, "When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt; I am the Lord your God." - Leviticus 19:33-34
