Portland emergency food program to honor volunteers for their service during Covid-19 pandemic with awards signed by President Biden

Since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Northeast Emergency Food Program (NEFP) has seen a dramatic increase in people served, from an average of 2,500 individuals per month to 45,000. Between March 2020 and May 2021, over 40 million pounds of food has been distributed to nearly 800,000 people. This has given NEFP the distinction of being the Oregon Food Banks largest serving Partner Agency. Serving this many people in need has only been possible with the help of more than 300 new volunteers. Over 70 of those volunteers have contributed more than 100 hours during the Covid-19 pandemic.

On July 23, 2021, NEFP will lift up these extraordinary volunteers at the "2021 Endurance Awards Ceremony." Each volunteer will be honored for their efforts with the Points of Light "**President's Volunteer Service Award.**" There will also be special recognition for longstanding volunteers, as well as businesses and other programs who came to NEFP's aid when called. Invited guests include Susannah Morgan, CEO of the Oregon Food Bank, and Sheyvette Dinkens, keynote speaker from Kansas City, Kan. The event will begin at 6 p.m. at Luther Memorial Lutheran Church, located at 4800 NE 72nd Ave., Portland, Ore.
